AACOG Weatherization Program

- Available in AACOG's planning region- Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, Medina, and Wilson
 - McMullen County is served by the Community Action Committee of Victoria
- Receives funding from three sources
- 1. Department of Energy (DOE)
 - o July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025
 - o \$721,198 in total funding
 - o Project Units- 50
 - o Cost per Unit-\$8,250
- 2. Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
 - January 1, 2024-December 31, 2024
 - o \$919,614 in total funding
 - o Project Units- 57
 - o Cost per Unit- \$12,000
- 3. Department of Energy Bipartisan Infrastructure Law
 - o July 15, 2023-June 20, 2026
 - \$3,511,208 in total funding
 - o Project Units-250
 - o Cost per Unit-\$8250

• Eligibility

- Single-family or multi-family units are eligible. Renters are able to apply with landlord written permission.
- All age groups are eligible as long as you have lived in your home for 12 months
- Priority is given to the elderly, disabled, homes with children under
 6 years old and those with a high energy burden
- Note: Does not cover home repairs such as roofing, plumbing, electrical or house leveling

- o Weatherizations services available once every 15 years
- Income must fall at or below the federally established income guidelines

- **Services Covered:** Attic/wall insulation, weather stripping of doors and windows, caulking, refridgerator, HVAC, stove, and water heater tuning or replacement
- Weatherization Process
 - o **Application** (will reach out for additional documents if necessary)
 - o Assessment (home inspection)
 - o Weatherization (contractors will complete weatherization work)
 - o Final Inspection
- Weatherization Readiness Funds
 - Fuding targeting deferred homes that can't be serviced by weatherization services
 - o Received \$71,125

AACOG

• Weatherization Assistance Program

- Services: Provides energy efficiency upgrades such as air sealing, insulation, lighting retrofits, refridgerator upgrades, furnace repair/replacements, and hot water system improvements.
- o **Eligibility**: Income-based, must meet federal guidelines. Available for single-family, manufactured, and multi-family housing.
 - o View Program Requirements and Eligible Projects
 - Note: Homes with major home repairs such as roofing, house leveling, plumbing or electrical issues may be deferred.

Texas Veterans Commission

• Housing for Texas Heroes Grant

- o **Services:** Corrects dangerous housing conditions such as plumbing, electrical, walls, and flooring issues to make home safe.
- Also offers weatherization upgrades to prevent elements from entering the home such as sealing of doors & windows, siding, roofing.
- o **Eligibility:** Low income veterans and surviving spouses that own and reside in their home. Must be current on property taxes and home loans.
 - o <u>View</u> Program Requirements and Eligible Projects
 - Note: 1ST priority for households with less than 50% of local area median income. 2nd priority to those less than 80%. Highest priority to veterans with disabilities who meet income requiements.

Community Council of South Central Texas (CCSCT)

• Weatherization Assistance Program

- o **Services**: Offers weatherization upgrades such as sealing, weather-stripping, insulation, and HVAC system replacements/ tune-ups.
- o **Eligibility**: Focuses on low-income households, prioritizing elderly and families with young children. All financial assistance is made based upon Federal Guidelines and Regulations of Poverty.
 - o <u>View</u> income eligibility
 - Eligible counties: Brewster, Dimmit, Crane, Culberson,
 Edwards, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, Kinney, LaSalle, Maverick,
 Pecos, Presidio, Real, Terrell, Uvalde, Val Verde, and Zavala

Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA)

• Weatherization Assistance Program:

- Services: Provides weatherization upgrades such as caulking, weather-stripping, insulation, duct work, tune up or replacement of heating and cooling systems and minor home repairs.
- Eligibility: Income-based, must meet <u>federal poverty guidelines</u>.
 LIHEAP WAP is calculated at 150% of Federal Poverty Income
 Guidelines and DOE WAP is calculated at 200% of Federal Poverty
 Income Guidelines.

USDA Single Family Housing Repair Loans and Grants Program

- **Services:** Provides loans to very-low-income homeowners to repair, improve or modernize their homes.
- Provides grants to elderly very-low-income homeowners to remove health and safety hazards.
- **Eligibility:** Must be the homeowner and occupy the house, be unable to obtain affordable credit elsewhere, have a household income that does not exceed the <u>very low limit</u> by county and be located in an <u>eligible</u> rural area. For grants, must be age 62 or older.

- Maximum loan is \$40,000 and maximum grant is \$10,000. May be combined

State Energy Conservation Office (SECO)

Rebates and Tax Credits

- Offers rebates and tax credits for residential energy efficiency and appliance upgrades
- Eligible projects may include, but are not limited to, upgrades or replacements of stoves, boilers, doors, air conditioners, dryers, windows, insulation, and heating equipment
- o <u>View</u> eligible products and how to claim a tax credit/rebate
 - o Can cover up to 30% of project costs
 - o No income requirement
- <u>Sign up</u> to receive updates on future rebates and grant opportunities for energy efficiency upgrades

City of San Antonio Based Services

• **Under 1 Roof Program**

- o **Services:** Assists homeowners with the replacement of worn shigles with new white shingle roofs and solar underlayment
- o **Eligibility:** Must be a homeowner, shingles must be worn or damaged, must live on property for five years after project completion.

Casa Verde

• Weatherization Assistance Program

- o **Services:** Provides free energy-efficiency upgrades such as insulation, air-sealing, light bulb replacement, and duct sealing.
- o **Eligibility:** Income-based, must meet monthly gross income requirements. Available for homeowners and renters
