6. Presentations:

A. Monthly National Weather Service Update- Jason Runyen

We are in the middle of surveys along the Guadalupe River, as well as doing other activities related to the extremely active weather we just experienced.

Mostly dry conditions are expected for the next 7 days. There is a slight chance for some precipitation of the Coastal Plains on Friday, but overall, things look pretty dry. The chance of rain will be around 5 percent or less each day.

A tropical disturbance is expected to move into the northeastern and north-central Gulf. There is a 40 percent chance of cyclone formation. However, current trends suggest this will not affect us.

High temperatures will be in the mid to upper 90s. Lows will be in the mid to upper 70s. With all the recent rains, it will be very humid out there. Chances of rain periodically. Nothing major of concern.

F. Public Health-

We have a full activation of course. We've got staff deployed running the operations section as well as staff in the ESF 8 desk at the Unified Command. Latest report that I've gotten is that we had 107 confirmed fatalities and we're still missing 93 individuals.

You know, weather has really been prohibited to getting a lot of the teams out there to perform searches and recovery. But we are expecting another influx of fatalities as weather allows those teams to get back out there.

9. Discussion and appropriate action on REPAC policies and procedures

A. add CERT to the proposed policy #2 regarding project funding priorities.

Policy #2 Project Funding Priorities

In alignment with our regional homeland security objectives and the need to maintain essential technological and operational support for emergency coordination, the RIC, CERT and WAVE Network Engineer and the WebEOC Training and Administration projects shall be designated as top funding priorities in the State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) allocations. These projects shall be designated as ranking 2, 3 and 4, behind Homeland Security Planning, in the annual REPAC funding allocations. This ensures continuity of operations, technical support, and situational awareness capabilities vital to the region's emergency response infrastructure. Changes in funding requests that result in increases for these projects must be approved by the REPAC during the ranking process.

There was discussion on adding the CERT program. They need to provide a bullet point justification, if you will, as to how the CERT program supports the regional program and all teams regionally. This was asked to be sent to Justin and Jeff.

This is one of the documents, the procedures that the governor's office uses to ensure that it kind of aligns with the goals and so just the overall concern is that you want to ensure that it's fully documented on how CERT serves the region. This is the only one that is questionable in description. You kind of see how it goes for the other ones.

A **motion** was made by **Scott Moreland** and seconded by **Bryce Houlton** to approve the wording as presented provided the CERT program has proven they are a regional program as requested.
